- Hedy Lamarr is buried in Wiener Zentralfriedhof in Vienna.

This exhibition honours Hedy Lamarr (1914–2000), a woman whose extraordinary career took her from Austria to the studios of Hollywood, made her the most beautiful woman in the world, a glamorous actress, a decadent star, and the inventor of Wi-Fi, but also an artist, whose painting and drawing practice is not very well known.

Through this exhibition project, conceived with the artist Nina Childress, "Hedy Lamarr - The Strange Woman" invites twelve artists to share their visions of this exceptional woman. In keeping with the domestic architecture of La Galerie, the exhibition's design paints a portrait of this "strange woman", intertwining existing objects (photographs, paperbooks, souvenirs, and more) with works borrowed or produced for the occasion.

Hedy Lamarr's impact on our collective imagination is put into context, with ideas opening up a wide panorama, from Vienna to Hollywood, even Noisy-le-Sec: decorative arts, iconography, a form of queer aesthetics, technology, fetishism, etc. From painting to video, and including photography and sculpture, each artist focuses on one aspect of the life of Hedy Lamarr, keeping alive the flame of this atypical icon, cultivating the memory of her unknown destiny.

NINA CHILDRESS



Nina Childress (born in 1961 in Pasadena, California) lives and works in Paris. She studied at École Nationale Supérieure des Arts Décoratifs de Paris (ENSAD), and at École Nationale Supérieure des Beaux-arts de Paris where she currently teaches. In 2021, Nina Childress was nominated for the Chevalier of the Legion of Honor for her career in the arts.

In the early 1980s, Childress was an active member of the French post-punk movement with her group Lucrate Milk; she began painting then. From 1985 to 1989, she joined the collective Les Frères Ripoulin, to which Pierre Huyghe and Claude Closky also belonged.

In speaking about her practice, Childress describes her paintings as "conceptual and dumb", never keeping herself in a box and constantly changing her subjects. Today, her focus is chiefly on portraits of glamorous female idols of the stage and screen such as Sylvie Vartan, Kate Bush and Hedy Lamarr. In 2015-2016, she was granted a year of study and research leave to study in the United States about the amateur painting of this Hollywood actress.

Nina Childress is represented by the Nathalie Karg Gallery in New York and by the gallery Art : Concept in Paris.

INTERVIEW BETWEEN MARC BEMBEKOFF AND NINA CHILDRESS (extract)

Marc Bembekoff: If there is a specific starting point for this project, it is your love for the cinema.

Nina Childress: It's true! It all started at the Cinémathèque française when I saw two of Hedy Lamarr's films (which for me are her two best films): *Experiment Perilous* (1944) and *The Strange Woman* (1946). I was fascinated by this actress about whom I knew nothing and whom I found incredibly beautiful. I then learnt about her career, first online, and then by reading her autobiography¹ and her biographies.

Usually at times like that I want to make a painting. So I collected documents and happened upon a portrait of her in colour that I really liked. I painted it, but I didn't feel like I'd found what I wanted to convey about my connection to this figure. So the idea came to me to design an exhibition with other artists to talk about her, not just to represent her.

MB You began your research, which led to the discovery that Hedy Lamarr was herself an artist.

NC Yes! When I read one of her biographies I discovered that she had painted. Of course, I really wanted to see her work. But apart from some mentions in texts and photographs of her painting, I couldn't find any reproductions of her work. So I decided to take a year's sabbatical to undertake a real research project. This enabled me to go to California and meet her son Anthony Loder who let me photograph her drawings and paintings.

MB In addition to your realisation of the difficulty of representing Hedy Lamarr, you also started thinking about an exhibition project to put her into perspective with contemporary artists.

NC Yes, I imagined that this would fascinate all my artist friends! I have to say that I'm quite obsessive and at that time I was really obsessed with her. I lent out DVDs, I took people to the movies, and more!

MB The idea behind the exhibition is to invite different artists around the figure of Hedy Lamarr, in either a direct or indirect way, by creating, for example, a universe to which she could respond.

NC Yes, I wanted to avoid being too literal. I preferred playing with allusions that amplify the feelings. I thought of artists who, through their work, could be interested in her. And I didn't want to limit myself to painting.

LA GALERIE, CENTRE D'ART CONTEMPORAIN DE NOISY-LE-SEC

La Galerie, centre d'art contemporain de Noisy-le-Sec has been granted of national interest. Launched in 1999 by the City of Noisy-le-Sec, the structure is backed by the Île-de-France Region Cultural Affairs Office (DRAC) – Ministry of Culture, the Seine-Saint-Denis Department and the Île-de-France Region.

It is also part of d.c.a – association de développement des centres d'artcontemporain, tram – réseau art contemporain Paris/Île-de-France, Arts en résidence – réseau national et BLA ! Association des professionnel·le·s de la médiation en art contemporain.

The La Galerie programme reflects the diversity of doday's art in terms of a range of aesthetic and social issues, via the work of emergent or established artists with local, national or international reputations. The programme revolves around two main themes: first of all *genius loci*, the spirit of place defined by the centre's distinctive architectural, social and historical associations; and secondly, the word galerie ("gallery"), with its different meanings and implications.

The exhibitions

Gallery: A room or building for the display of works of art

For its four annual exhibitions, the programme systematically starts out from specific ideas or pretexts, either literary, architectural or musical. The avenues explored by these solo and collective exhibitions complement each other, while opening up fresh perspectives and lines of enquiry.

Receptivity and commitment to the local

Gallery: A long room or passage, partly open at the side; a balcony providing space for an audience Ongoing work on the Grand Paris project is bringing radical change to Noisy-le-Sec and the intermunicipal Est Ensemble locality. La Galerie is participating by going out to make contact with potential visitors and engage in collaborative ventures with publics otherwise lacking the chance to develop a taste for today's visual arts. The art centre functions as an incubator for ideas, an agora where knowledge can be shared in close connection with the region's new visual arts organisations, notably Micro-Folie Noisy-le-Sec and Komunuma in nearby Romainville.

The cultural programme

Gallery: A group of spectators

The fundamental principles of an art centre: to guide and assist the emergence of challenging projects and their production and dissemination, while constantly mindful of the need for accessibility for the public at large. In line with these requirements, La Galerie's cultural programme is aimed at establishing a dynamic of "social involvement", of interplay with Noisy-le-Sec residents that will let them "blow the spectators away". This project stresses a day-to-day forging of links between the aesthetic and the social spheres, between an exacting creativity receptive to the world and its challenges, and a cultural transmission adapted to each individual. With respect to contemporary art – and especially its artists – modes of seeing, encountering and living together are imaginable, which it seems important to make the most of. The urban and social context offered by La Galerie is an ideal tool for contributing to dialogue between artists, local stakeholders and the various publics.
